



Awards Criteria

Delegation Awards

CMUN 2023 will have 3 Delegation Awards, which are as follows:

- 1 Best Delegation Award
- 2 Outstanding Delegation Awards

To be eligible for a delegation award, a delegation must comprise a minimum of 8 delegates. Awards are given on the basis of the ratio of individual awards to the total number of delegates in the delegation. CMUN 2023 has a provision by which two delegations per school may attend the conference. In the case of such a school, delegation awards are independent of each other. Awards of The International Press Corps will not be considered in the calculation of Delegation Awards. In case of a tie, the delegation with the most Best Delegate awards would prevail. If there is any conflict in this matter, the decision of the CMUN Coordinators will be final and binding.

Delegate Awards

Awards are given to delegates on the basis of their performance over the three days of the conference. The respective committee Directors take decisions on awards after consultation with the committee staff and the Secretary-General. We at CMUN take a holistic approach towards awards and while there is no set formula, they are generally given to candidates who have performed well in all aspects of Model UN, primarily speaking, lobbying and paperwork. In double delegate committees, awards are given on a delegation basis and not to individual delegates. Along with the criteria mentioned above, teamwork and equality among co-delegates in terms of skill and proficiency is an important factor. If a conflict arises regarding awards, the decision of the Secretary General will be final and binding.

Note

1. The award distribution enlisted above is representative of the maximum number of awards available in each committee. However, it is not necessary that the maximum number of awards be given. The Directors will evaluate their committee's performance and progress while also factoring in individual performance when determining the number of awards to be presented. With respect to matters of this nature, the Secretary-General's decision is final and binding.
2. In addition to the aforementioned awards, the Executive Board of each committee is at liberty to award any number of verbal Diplomatic Commendations, at their discretion, to delegates who have exemplified the diplomatic and collaborative spirit of CMUN.
3. All awards will be presented on the final day of the conference (20th August, 2023) in the form of physical certificates.
4. The allocation policy for CMUN 2023 is that at least one member of every delegation will be assigned a role in a General Assembly.
